


Why do we have this meeting?




-Issue particularly of sight lines at junctions (Howard Cornish, Church Street), plus general appearance of village

The yellow area is the 'Meadow Area'.




-Footpaths / TOE grant (Green Working Party):





Speed Limit Changes Marcham -



OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (MARCHAM PARISH) (SPEED LIMITS) ORDER 2024

NOTICE is given that on 13 May 2024 Oxfordshire County Council made the above order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The order, which comes into force on **20 May** introduces a **20mph speed limit** throughout Marcham replacing the majority of the 30mph speed limits in the process - leading outwards to the following points:

- 1. A415 Frilford Road a point 70 metres southwest of Church Street,
- 2. A415 Marcham Road a point 50 metres east of Howard Cornish Road,
- 3. Kings Avenue its junction with North Street,
- 4. Mill Road a point 205 metres south of Priory Lane,
- North Street / Sheepstead Road a point 55 metres north of its junction with Howard Cornish Road.
- 6. The Farthings its junction with North Street.

Sections of existing 30mph speed limit remain in place on the A415 Frilford Road & Sheepstead Road as 'buffer' limits, with Officers having taken the current road environment & traffic usage into account.

The Oxfordshire County Council (Marcham Parish) (Speed Limits) Order 2020 is revoked/replaced.

MARCHAM: SHEEPSTEAD ROAD - PROPOSED EXTENSION OF 30MPH SPEED LIMIT

RECOMMENDATION

 The Cabinet Member for Highway Management is RECOMMENDED to approve the extension of the 30mph speed limit on Sheepstead Road in Marcham as advertised.

Executive summary

 The report presents responses to a statutory consultation on a proposed extension of the existing 30mph speed limit on Sheepstead Road by 115 metres to its junction with the Cow Lane & West Down Lane tracks as a result of adjacent residential development, as shown in **Annex 1**.
